Easter is upon us, and it is such a glorious season! It's important to remember that this is a season, not simply a day. Yes, we will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus on Easter morning, but let us encourage you not to skip directly to that moment without recognizing the events leading up to it. This season isn't just about the ending (Jesus' victory over death), it's about the journey. A journey we are invited to walk through each year as we prepare our hearts and minds for the cornerstone of our Christian faith.

This journey matters and will directly affect how you end up experiencing Jesus' resurrection on Easter morning. Embracing the journey will allow you to truly grasp (mind, body, and spirit) the significance of this season. Maybe this is a good time to pick one of the Gospels and start reading it, refamiliarize yourself with the life and ministry of Jesus. Remind yourself of His message, His miracles, His compassion and heart for everyone He came across. Remind yourself why people chose to follow Him. And as we head into Holy Week, we will celebrate the Hosannas of Palm Sunday.

This year we will have a Maundy Thursday service (April 18, 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary) in which we'll recognize the Last Supper and the night in which Christ gave himself up for us. We will also have a Good Friday service (April 19, 7:00 p.m. in the gym) to recognize Jesus' death. These are not optional parts of the Easter story; they are a part of the journey. Ignoring or skipping a part of the journey will diminish your Easter experience. However, if you are dedicated to walking through this season, we can assure you that this Easter will

be one of the most glorious Easters of your life.

How can we be so sure? Simply put, it's the next Easter. It's the next opportunity to ride this emotional rollercoaster of Jesus' life, ministry, sacrifice, death, and resurrection. It's the next opportunity you have to put yourself into the awesome story of God's love. You're not going to want to miss a single moment of it. In fact, this is one of those seasons in which the world around us is open to God's story. Take advantage of that by inviting someone to church (there are plenty of opportunities); invite them to walk this journey with you. We look forward to experiencing this Easter season with you all.

The Cooperative Ministry Executive Team (made up of leaders from both congregations) has been tasked with figuring out how our two churches will come together. For example, it has been decided that as one church we will retain the Mt. Comfort UMC name. This team has been hard at work, and with the help of a church consultant, is tackling several important issues such as church governance, staffing needs, finances, communication, and new worship times. Although the details continue to be a work in progress, there are two important things happening in May we want you to be aware of.

- **Sunday, May 5** – This will be defined as a Day of Celebration! After worship we will gather in the gym to welcome into membership those from MTC who have chosen to join Mt. Comfort UMC. We will have a Church Conference to affirm and adopt the work of the Cooperative Ministry Executive Team as it pertains to governance, leaders, and budget. And then together we will have a fantastic Cinco De Mayo feast.
- **Sunday, May 26**– Our new Sunday morning schedule will begin. Traditional worship will be offered in the sanctuary at 9:30 a.m. Contemporary worship will be offered in the gym at 10:45 a.m. Sunday School will take place at 10:45 a.m. Rest assured, this change will continue to be communicated in a variety of ways as we get closer to the date.

Easter Rocks Sermon Series

Join us for Sunday Worship at 10:30 a.m., special Holy Week services, and special activities.

April 7 – Altar Rocks, Exodus 20:22-26

This message looks at God's instructions to Moses about the proper use of altars. God commanded us to build an altar "wherever I cause my name to be remembered." Today we represent those altars with our lives. **Lunch** – After worship both congregations are invited to a light lunch and rock painting. You can paint rocks that will have a special Easter invite and words of encouragement to place around our communities/neighborhoods.

April 14 – Cheering Rocks (Palm Sunday), Luke 19:28-40

Jesus, when chastised about the crowds singing Hosannas, responded that if the people kept quiet, the stones along the road would burst into cheers.

Easter Egg stuffing party – Join us at 6:00 p.m. in the Family Life Center as we prepare for the Easter Egg Hunt by stuffing candy in all those plastic eggs.

April 18, Maundy Thursday – Upon this Rock (Sanctuary, 7:00 p.m.) Matthew 16:13-20 | Matthew 26:17-35, 69-75

Jesus called Peter the "Rock," indicating a solid foundation upon which the church will be built.

Communion will be served.

April 19, Good Friday – The Rejected Rock (FLC gym, 7:00 p.m.) Psalm 118:22 | Matthew 21:42 | Matthew 27:11-54

Jesus was called the "cornerstone," and it was predicted that the Cornerstone would be rejected by the builders. How often do we cast aside Christ?

April 21 – The Rolled-Away Rock (Easter Sunday), John 20 | Mark 16

A message focused on Jesus' resurrection. How must it have felt when the women discovered the rolled-away rock? A symbol of light eradicating darkness, of life defeating death, of love overpowering hate.

April 28 – Throwing Rocks, Acts 7

What rocks does the church throw today? How are we silencing the message of Christ? How are we killing the mission God has given us?

Service Swap– The Coop Executive Team members ask you to get out of your comfort zone and "swap services" this Sunday, in order to better grasp what the other congregation does. The MTC congregation is asked to worship in the sanctuary; the MCUMC congregation is asked to worship in the gym.


From the Director, Christine Sturgis

Mrs. Wigger also explained that the animated feature film, *Bee Movie*, inaccurately shows male drones contributing to the honey-making process, when in fact, honey-making is the exclusive job of the female honey bees who do all of the important work in a hive. These facts elicited a loud cheer from the girls!

Winter is almost over, so the Trustees can start getting back to the exterior building repairs. The Family Life Center's exterior EIFS siding is going to be pressure washed to remove any stains or loose material. Afterward, the several places where siding is coming loose can be repaired.

Your help is needed as we are responsible for cleaning and repairing the gutters. Hopefully, we can do this in April. We have a couple of sections of roofing that will be repaired or replaced to prevent future water leaks.

Other Needs –New exterior lights are needed in several places around the church buildings. An Outdoor Clean-up day is set for April 14, 1 – 6:00 p.m. For the interior, the installation of ceramic tile in the entryways and restrooms was approved, and we are waiting on a contractor.
